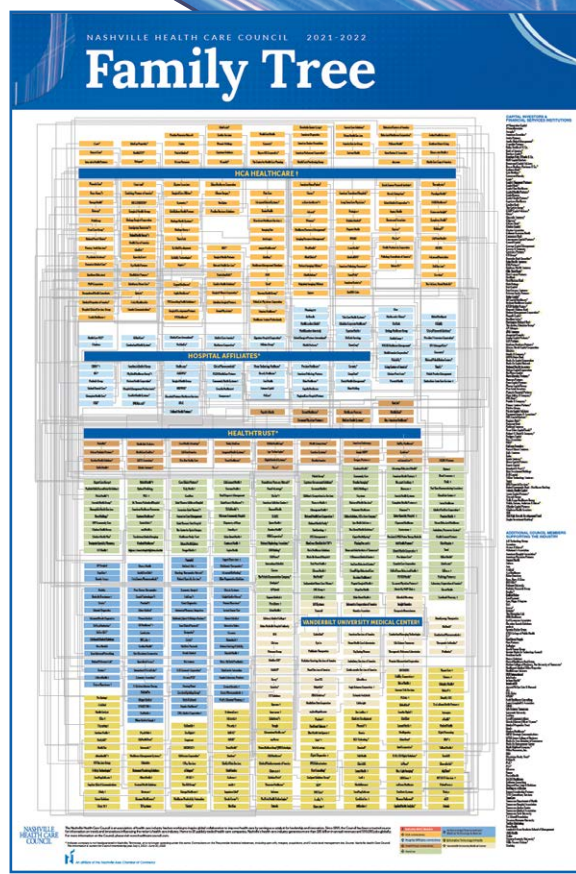

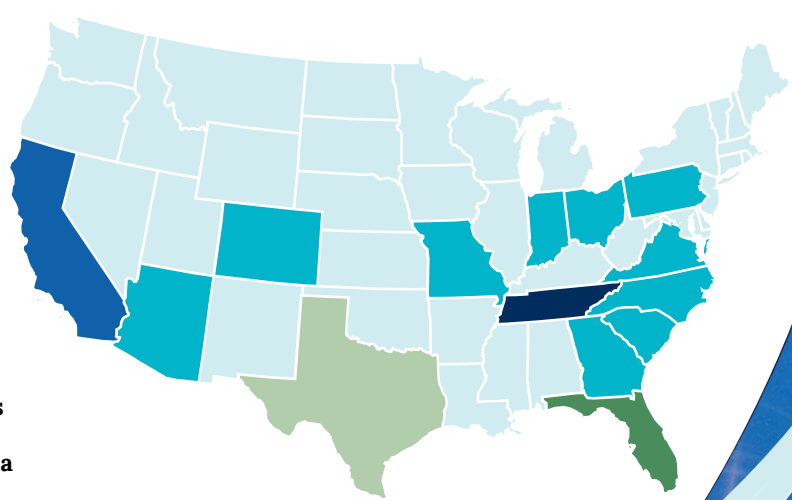
Globally, Nashville's healthcare industry generates **more than \$95 billion** in revenue and **nearly 500,000 jobs**.

Healthcare Next

In celebration of the Council's 25th anniversary, a panel of Nashville's industry leaders explored the pandemic's impact on healthcare and forecasted the future of the industry. Speakers **Sam Hazen**, CEO, HCA Healthcare, **James Hildreth, M.D.**, president and CEO, Meharry Medical College, and **Paul Kusserow**, chairman and CEO, Amedisys, shared how COVID-19 accelerated innovation and how their businesses are approaching the new era of healthcare.



Shifting Roles and Expectations in Healthcare Policy

Looking ahead to the upcoming midterm elections, the Council hosted a policy discussion with some of the country's most powerful healthcare trade association leaders. Guests included **Matt Eyles**, president and CEO, AHIP, **Chip Kahn**, president and CEO, Federation of American Hospitals, **Tom Leary**, senior vice president and head of government

relations, HIMSS, and moderator **Melinda Buntin**, Mike Curb professor and chair of the Department of Health Policy, Vanderbilt University School of Medicine. Members gained insights into the speakers' priorities in Washington and issues they are anticipating in the current political environment.

"We want to find ways for technology to support health equity. But what we are lacking is data modernization. You can't have quality data when you're still using paper and fax machines. We need a strong investment from the government to get us to a place where we have a good baseline to measure efforts," said **Leary**.



Transformation and Innovation

Devoted Health Co-Founder and Executive Chairman **Todd Park** shared advice for entrepreneurs aiming to transform healthcare. The session was moderated by former Senate Majority Leader Bill Frist.

Consumerism in Healthcare – What's Next?



Panelists **Richard Ashworth**, president and CEO, Tivity Health and **Marcus Osborne**, former senior vice president, health transformation, Walmart, discussed the rise in patient-centered healthcare delivery and challenges the industry still faces in making this shift. **Marcus Whitney**, founding partner, Jumpstart Health Investors, moderated the discussion.

"On one hand, there are so many innovators transforming the system, and that's great. But on the other hand, people are overwhelmed by options. We need companies to take ideas we know that we need and make them the most effective in the marketplace," Osborne said.

Financing the Industry

The Council's signature finance programs equip members with the crucial information needed to make well-informed business decisions that promote continued business growth, investment in innovation and high-quality patient care. In 2022, the Council engaged some of the nation's leading healthcare investment experts – from venture, private equity and Wall Street – to provide insights on the state of the market and outlook for healthcare industry sectors.



Developing Healthcare Ventures: Investor and Entrepreneur Collaborations

The Council partnered with the Nashville Capital Network to present a discussion with seasoned venture capital experts on the ins and outs of funding early stage ventures. Panelists included **Annie Lamont**, co-founder and managing partner, Oak HC/FT, **Ben Leedle**, president and CEO, Blue Zones, **G.B. Pratt**, founder and CEO, ModifyHealth, and **Brad Smith**, CEO, Main Street Health. The discussion was moderated by **Leigh Walton**, senior partner, Bass, Berry & Sims.

"We've been an advocate and investor in primary care for a long time. Taking risk with primary care is something we're serious and passionate about and is a way to solve the downstream healthcare problems of cost and access," Lamont said.



Wall Street's View of Prospects for the Healthcare Industry

A panel of top Wall Street analysts identified several trends to watch, including primary care, behavioral healthcare, home health, telehealth, women's health, social determinants of health and health equity. The conversation was moderated by **Paul Kusserow**, CEO and chairman, Amedisys, and included **Matt Larew**, equity research analyst, William Blair, **A.J. Rice**, managing director, Credit Suisse, and **Brian Tanquilut**, senior vice president, services equity research, Jeffries.

"In this uncertain environment, investors have been pickier, and quality is the most important measure. Valuations have compressed, and it's about execution. Companies that can show they can grow into new markets are the ones that will do better, at least in the next 12 months," Tanquilut said.

Financing the Deal

Midway through the calendar year, a panel of private equity investors discussed recent healthcare deal activity and predictions for what's to come. Speakers included **Buddy Gumina**, founder and managing partner, Grant Avenue Capital, **Anna Haghgooie**, managing director, Valtruis, **David Schuppan**, senior partner and co-head, healthcare, The Vistria Group, **Casey West**, managing partner, SSM Partners, and moderator **Tom Wyllly**, senior partner, Brentwood Capital Advisors.

"There is such a great mentorship community here in Nashville helping young entrepreneurs create companies," said Haghgooie. "Here, entrepreneurs are able to surround themselves with people who've been there and done that, which shows a lot of credibility to investors."



New Wave of Healthcare Investment in Nashville



The Covid-19 pandemic greatly accelerated the adoption of digital health technologies, advancing the industry by years of progress in just a matter of months. The "New Wave of Healthcare" event explored the dramatic shifts occurring in the ecosystem and how Nashville's new investment funds are tapping into innovative solutions.

Adam Boehler, CEO, Rubicon Founders, **Brad Smith**, founder and CEO, Russell Street Ventures, and **Marcus Whitney**, co-founder and managing partner, Jumpstart Nova, served as panelists with **Anna Haghgooie**, managing director, Valtruis, moderating the discussion.

"Thinking about underserved and vulnerable populations, that's where there is a lot of opportunity to make a difference. It takes looking at a very specific subset, such as rural health, long-term care or intellectually disabled populations, and finding creative ways to bring better, coordinated care at a high value," said Smith.

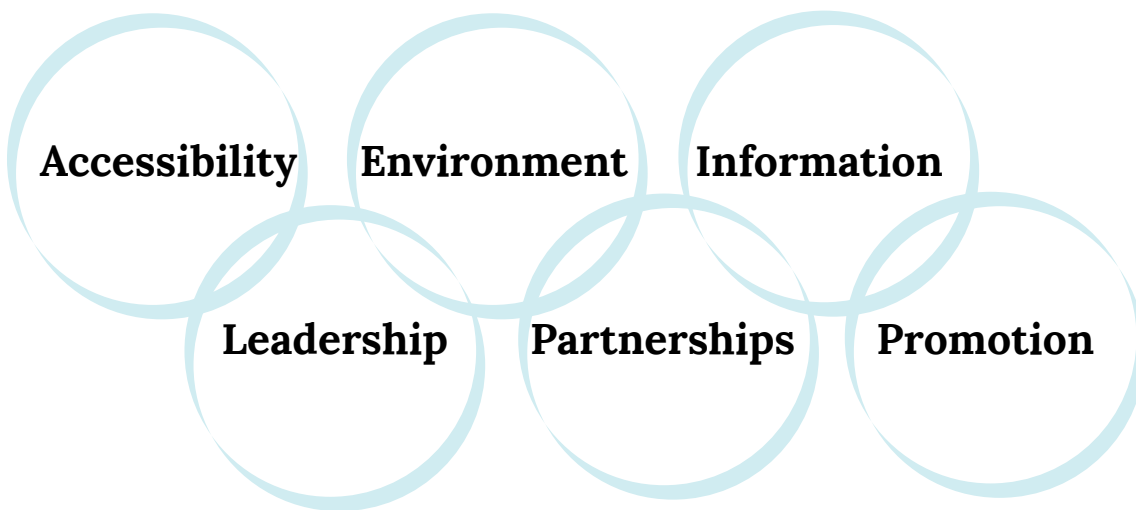
